**** Music Notes:** Orlando Gibbons (1583-1623) was a leading composer of the Elizabethan Era. His choral and keyboard works are highly regarded; Glenn Gould named Gibbons his favourite composer.

The offertory anthem *If music be the food of love* is a direct quotation of only the opening seven words heard in *Twelfth Night*. Purcell set this text, by Colonel Henry Heveningham, twice in the 1690's. *Blow, blow thou winter wind* is sung by Amiens in Act II, Sc VII of *As You Like It*. The song comes at the end of the scene in which Jaques delivers his infamous "All The World's A Stage" soliloquy. Here, Amiens compares Nature to Man, the latter unkind: "most friendship is feigning, most loving is folly." Nature may produce freezing weather, Amiens sings, but "that does not bite so nigh as benefits forgot: Though thou waters warp, they sting is not so sharp as friend remember'd not."
